- 10 (c) Detention in jail prohibited. -- It is unlawful for any
- 11 person in charge of or employed by a jail knowingly to receive
- 12 for detention or to detain in the jail any person whom he has or
- 13 should have reason to believe is a child unless, in a criminal
- 14 proceeding, the child has been charged with [or has been found
- 15 quilty of an act set forth in paragraph (2)(i), (ii), (iii) or
- 16 (v) of the definition of "delinquent act" in section 6302
- 17 (relating to definitions). the crime of murder.
