## AN ACT

- 4 This chapter relates to the Identification Upon Reentry
- 5 Program.
- 6 § 49A02. Definitions.
- 7 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 8 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 9 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 10 "Acceptable proof of residency." A current and unexpired
- 11 <u>driver's license or photo identification card, vehicle</u>
- 12 <u>registration card, auto insurance card, computer generated</u>
- 13 <u>utility bill showing a person's name and address, postmarked</u>
- 14 mail or package label, W 2 form or pay stub, lease agreement or
- 15 mortgage document or official tax record reflecting a person's
- 16 <u>name and address.</u>
- 17 <u>"Article." The following:</u>
- 18 (1) A Social Security card.
- 19 <u>(2) An acceptable proof of residency.</u>
- 20 "Assist." Printing necessary forms, ensuring that an
- 21 eligible offender has filled forms out correctly with sufficient
- 22 information, facilitating communication between an eligible
- 23 offender and State agencies and keeping an eligible offender
- 24 updated on the developments of their case.
- 25 "Certificate." A birth certificate, certificate of United
- 26 States citizenship or certificate of naturalization.
- 27 <u>"Costs." Application fees and translation services and other</u>
- 28 goods or services that require a payment from an eligible
- 29 <del>offender.</del>
- 30 "Eligible offender." An incarcerated individual who is to be

- 1 released from a State correctional institution or juvenile
- 2 detention facility and who shall continue residing in this
- 3 Commonwealth upon release and has not decided to opt out of the
- 4 <del>program.</del>
- 5 <u>"Program." The Identification Upon Reentry Program</u>
- 6 <u>established under section 49A03 (relating to establishment).</u>
- 7 "Specified area." An area within this Commonwealth,
- 8 determined by the department, where driving a car is not
- 9 necessary due to access to public transportation or other
- 10 transportation.
- 11 "Work permit." A transferable work permit valid for minors
- 12 <u>16 and 17 years of age and valid for the entire time the minor</u>
- 13 <u>is eligible for work through 18 years of age.</u>
- 14 <u>§ 49A03. Establishment.</u>
- 15 The department, in collaboration with the Department of Human
- 16 <u>Services and the Department of Transportation, shall establish</u>
- 17 the Identification Upon Reentry Program to provide eligible
- 18 offenders with birth certificates, Social Security cards, photo-
- 19 <u>identification cards, driver's licenses in the form of camera or</u>
- 20 photo identification cards and work permits upon release from a
- 21 State correctional institution or juvenile detention center.
- 22 § 49A04. Administration.
- 23 The program shall be administered as follows:
- 24 (1) The department, the Department of Human Services and
- 25 <u>the Department of Transportation shall establish policies</u>
- 26 necessary to carry out the program, including program
- 27 <u>requirements and implementation.</u>
- 28 <u>(2) The department, the Department of Human Services and</u>
- 29 the Department of Transportation may seek Federal or State
- 30 funding to support the program.

	15) The department, the bepartment of haman betvices and
2	the Department of Transportation shall develop monitoring and
3	accountability systems to confirm that the program is being
4	efficiently carried out. The monitoring and accountability
5	systems shall include the submission of an annual report to
6	the Law and Justice Committee of the Senate and the Judiciary
7	Committee of the House of Representatives. The annual report
8	shall include the number and percentage of offenders released
9	with articles, certificates, camera or photo identification
10	cards and driver's licenses and the number and percentage of
11	offenders released without such documents and the reasons
12	why.
13	§ 49A05. Guidelines.
14	The following guidelines shall apply:
15	(1) Prior to the release of an eligible offender, the
16	department, in consultation with the Department of Human
17	Services and the Department of Transportation, shall assist
18	an eligible offender in obtaining the following:
19	(i) A birth certificate.
20	(ii) A Social Security card.
21	(iii) A photo identification card.
22	(iv) A driver's license in the form of a camera
23	<del>card.</del>
24	(v) A work permit.
25	(2) Once an eligible offender is made aware of the
26	eligible offender's ability to participate and available
27	options under the program, the eligible offender may opt out
28	of participation in the program.
29	(3) The department, in consultation with the Department
30	of Human Services and the Department of Transportation shall

1	assist an eligible offender in obtaining the necessary
2	articles and certificates needed to apply for a driver's
3	license, photo identification card and work permit.
4	(4) If an eligible offender was born in another state or
5	became a United States citizen or a naturalized citizen, the
6	department and the Department of Human Services shall remain
7	responsible for assisting the eligible offender in obtaining
8	the necessary documents from the appropriate agencies before
9	the eligible offender is released.
10	(5) The Department of Transportation, in cooperation
11	with the department, shall issue a renewed or replacement
12	driver's license in the form of a camera card to an eligible
13	offender deemed eligible to drive.
14	(6) If an eligible offender's driver's license is
15	expired, the department, in cooperation with the Department
16	of Transportation, shall renew the eligible offender's
17	driver's license.
18	(7) The Department of Transportation, in cooperation
19	with the department and the Department of Human Services,
20	shall issue a new or replacement photo identification card in
21	the form of a camera or photo identification card to an
22	eligible offender who is not old enough to drive or resides
23	in a specified area.
24	(8) If an eligible offender's driver's license has been
25	issued a definite suspension by the Department of
26	Transportation, the department, in cooperation with the
27	Department of Transportation, shall provide the offender with
28	a restoration requirement letter, assist the eligible
29	offender in applying for reinstatement and inform the
30	eligible offender of when the application will be approved.

issued an indefinite suspension by the Department of

Transportation, the department shall issue the eligible

offender a photo identification card in the form of a camera

card and the Department of Transportation shall provide the

offender with a pamphlet that includes the steps that the

eligible offender must take to contest a suspended license

resulting from a court conviction.

license cannot be reinstated prior to the eligible offender's release, the Department of Transportation shall inform the eligible offender of the option to apply for an occupational limited license or a probationary license. If the eligible offender decides to apply, the department, in cooperation with the Department of Transportation, shall assist the offender in applying for the occupational limited license or a probationary license, including assisting the eligible offender in filling out and sending a probationary license petition or an occupational limited license petition, paying all appropriate petition fees, updating the eligible offender on the Department of Transportation's response to the petition and delivering an occupational limited license camera card to a qualifying offender.

the eligible offender's 18th birthday and the offender meets
eligibility requirements under the act of October 24, 2012
(P.L.1209, No.151), known as the Child Labor Act, the
Department of Labor and Industry, in cooperation with the
Department of Human Services, shall issue a work permit to an eligible offender under 18 years of age once all requirements

- 7 <u>of obtaining work permits for eligible offenders.</u>

- 7 "COSTS." APPLICATION FEES AND TRANSLATION SERVICES AND OTHER
- 8 GOODS OR SERVICES THAT REQUIRE A PAYMENT FROM AN ELIGIBLE
- 9 OFFENDER.
- 10 "ELIGIBLE OFFENDER." AN INCARCERATED INDIVIDUAL WHO IS TO BE
- 11 RELEASED FROM A STATE CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTION AND HAS DECIDED
- 12 TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PROGRAM.
- 13 "PROGRAM." THE IDENTIFICATION UPON REENTRY PROGRAM
- 14 ESTABLISHED UNDER SECTION 49A03 (RELATING TO ESTABLISHMENT).
- 15 § 49A03. ESTABLISHMENT.
- 16 THE DEPARTMENT, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF
- 17 HEALTH AND THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, SHALL ESTABLISH THE
- 18 IDENTIFICATION UPON REENTRY PROGRAM TO PROVIDE ELIGIBLE
- 19 OFFENDERS WITH BIRTH CERTIFICATES, SOCIAL SECURITY CARDS, PHOTO
- 20 IDENTIFICATION CARDS AND DRIVER'S LICENSES UPON RELEASE FROM A
- 21 STATE CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTION.
- 22 § 49A04. ADMINISTRATION.
- THE PROGRAM SHALL BE ADMINISTERED AS FOLLOWS:
- 24 (1) THE DEPARTMENT, THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND THE
- 25 <u>DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ESTABLISH POLICIES</u>
- 26 NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PROGRAM, INCLUDING PROGRAM
- 27 <u>REQUIREMENTS AND IMPLEMENTATION.</u>
- 28 (2) THE DEPARTMENT, THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND THE
- 29 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION MAY SEEK FEDERAL OR STATE
- 30 FUNDING TO SUPPORT THE PROGRAM.

Τ	(3) THE DEPARTMENT, THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND THE
2	DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL DEVELOP MONITORING AND
3	ACCOUNTABILITY SYSTEMS TO CONFIRM THAT THE PROGRAM IS BEING
4	EFFICIENTLY CARRIED OUT. THE MONITORING AND ACCOUNTABILITY
5	SYSTEMS SHALL INCLUDE THE SUBMISSION OF AN ANNUAL REPORT TO
6	THE LAW AND JUSTICE COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE AND THE JUDICIARY
7	COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. THE ANNUAL REPORT
8	SHALL INCLUDE THE NUMBER AND PERCENTAGE OF OFFENDERS RELEASED
9	WITH BIRTH CERTIFICATES, PHOTO IDENTIFICATION CARDS AND
10	DRIVER'S LICENSES AND THE NUMBER AND PERCENTAGE OF OFFENDERS
11	RELEASED WITHOUT SUCH DOCUMENTS AND THE REASONS WHY.
12	§ 49A05. GUIDELINES.
13	THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES SHALL APPLY:
14	(1) PRIOR TO THE RELEASE OF AN ELIGIBLE OFFENDER, THE
15	DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF
16	TRANSPORTATION, SHALL ASSIST AN ELIGIBLE OFFENDER IN
17	OBTAINING THE FOLLOWING:
18	(I) A PHOTO IDENTIFICATION CARD; OR
19	(II) A DRIVER'S LICENSE.
20	(2) ONCE AN ELIGIBLE OFFENDER IS MADE AWARE OF THE
21	ELIGIBLE OFFENDER'S ABILITY TO PARTICIPATE AND AVAILABLE
22	OPTIONS UNDER THE PROGRAM, THE ELIGIBLE OFFENDER MAY OPT OUT
23	OF PARTICIPATION IN THE PROGRAM.
24	(3) THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT
25	OF HEALTH AND THE SOCIAL SECURITY ADMINISTRATION, SHALL
26	ASSIST AN ELIGIBLE OFFENDER IN OBTAINING THE NECESSARY
27	DOCUMENTS, INCLUDING A SOCIAL SECURITY CARD AND BIRTH
28	CERTIFICATE, NEEDED TO APPLY FOR A DRIVER'S LICENSE OR PHOTO
29	IDENTIFICATION CARD.
30	(4) IF AN ELIGIBLE OFFENDER WAS BORN IN ANOTHER STATE OR

1 BECAME A UNITED STATES CITIZEN OR A NATURALIZED CITIZEN, THE 2 DEPARTMENT SHALL ASSIST THE ELIGIBLE OFFENDER IN OBTAINING 3 THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTS FROM THE APPROPRIATE AGENCIES TO 4 APPLY FOR A PHOTO IDENTIFICATION CARD OR DRIVER'S LICENSE. 5 (5) UPON APPLICATION, THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, 6 IN COOPERATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT, SHALL ISSUE A RENEWED OR 7 REPLACEMENT DRIVER'S LICENSE TO AN ELIGIBLE OFFENDER DEEMED 8 ELIGIBLE TO DRIVE. IF AN ELIGIBLE OFFENDER'S DRIVER'S LICENSE 9 IS EXPIRED OR THE ELIGIBLE OFFENDER IS IN NEED OF A 10 REPLACEMENT DRIVER'S LICENSE, THE DEPARTMENT, IN COOPERATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, SHALL ASSIST THE 11 ELIGIBLE OFFENDER WITH RENEWING THE ELIGIBLE OFFENDER'S 12 13 DRIVER'S LICENSE OR REQUESTING A REPLACEMENT. (6) UPON APPLICATION, THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, 14 IN COOPERATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE A NEW, RENEWED 15 OR REPLACEMENT PHOTO IDENTIFICATION CARD TO AN ELIGIBLE 16 17 OFFENDER. 18 (7) IF AN ELIGIBLE OFFENDER'S DRIVING PRIVILEGE IS UNDER A TERM OR INDEFINITE SUSPENSION BY THE DEPARTMENT OF 19 TRANSPORTATION, THE DEPARTMENT, IN COOPERATION WITH THE 20 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, SHALL PROVIDE THE OFFENDER WITH 21 22 A RESTORATION REQUIREMENTS LETTER AND THE DEPARTMENT SHALL 23 ASSIST THE ELIGIBLE OFFENDER IN APPLYING FOR A PHOTO 24 IDENTIFICATION CARD. 25 (8) IF AN ELIGIBLE OFFENDER'S DRIVER'S LICENSE IS 26 EXPIRED OR THE ELIGIBLE OFFENDER IS IN NEED OF A REPLACEMENT 27 DRIVER'S LICENSE, THE DEPARTMENT, IN COOPERATION WITH THE 28 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, SHALL ASSIST THE ELIGIBLE 29 OFFENDER WITH RENEWING THE ELIGIBLE OFFENDER'S DRIVER'S

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LICENSE OR REQUESTING A REPLACEMENT.

- 1 (9) IF AN ELIGIBLE OFFENDER'S DRIVING PRIVILEGE CANNOT
- 2 BE REINSTATED PRIOR TO RELEASE, THE DEPARTMENT, IN
- 3 COOPERATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, SHALL
- 4 INFORM THE ELIGIBLE OFFENDER OF THE OPTION TO APPLY FOR AN
- 5 OCCUPATIONAL LIMITED LICENSE OR A PROBATIONARY LICENSE AND
- 6 PROVIDE INFORMATION RELATING TO OCCUPATIONAL LIMITED LICENSES
- 7 AND PROBATIONARY LICENSES.
- 8 § 49A06. RESPONSIBILITIES OF PAYING COSTS.
- 9 AN ELIGIBLE OFFENDER SHALL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY COSTS
- 10 ASSOCIATED WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS CHAPTER.
- 11 § 49A07. RULES AND REGULATIONS.
- 12 THE DEPARTMENT, THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND THE DEPARTMENT
- 13 OF TRANSPORTATION MAY PROMULGATE RULES AND REGULATIONS NECESSARY
- 14 TO IMPLEMENT THIS CHAPTER.
- 15 SECTION 2. THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IN 60 DAYS.
