## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9	Amending the act of January 14, 1952 (1951 P.L.1898, No.522), entitled "An act to provide for the better protection of life and health of the citizens of this Commonwealth by requiring and regulating the examination, licensure and registration of persons and registration of corporations engaging in the care, preparation and disposition of the bodies of deceased persons, and providing penalties; providing for a State Board of Funeral Directors in the Department of State, and repealing other laws," further providing for duties of board.
10	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
11	hereby enacts as follows:
12	Section 1. Section 16(b) of the act of January 14, 1952
13	(1951 P.L.1898, No.522), known as the Funeral Director Law, is
14	amended to read:
15	Section 16. Duties of Board* * *
16	(b) The board shall appoint an inspector or inspectors whose
17	title shall be "Inspector, State Board of Funeral Directors,
18	Commonwealth of Pennsylvania." Such inspectors shall be licensed
19	funeral directors who have been actively engaged in the practice
20	of such profession for at least [ten] <u>five</u> years. Inspectors
21	shall hold office at the pleasure of the board, and shall

1 receive such compensation as shall be fixed by the board with the approval of the department. Inspectors shall be empowered to 2 serve all processes and papers of the board, and shall have the 3 right of entry into any place, where the business or profession 4 of funeral directing is carried on or advertised as being 5 carried on, for the purpose of inspection and for the 6 investigation of complaints coming before the board and for such 7 other matters as the board may direct. 8

10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
