## A RESOLUTION

- Directing the Joint State Government Commission to conduct a study on the Commonwealth's response to COVID-19.
- 3 WHEREAS, COVID-19 is an infectious disease caused by the
- 4 SARS-CoV-2 virus and was first discovered in December 2019; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Most people infected with COVID-19 will experience
- 6 mild to moderate respiratory illness and recover without
- 7 requiring special treatment, however, some will become seriously
- 8 ill and require medical attention; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Older people and those with underlying medical
- 10 conditions like cardiovascular disease, diabetes, chronic
- 11 respiratory disease or cancer are more likely to develop serious
- 12 illness; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Anyone can get sick with COVID-19 and become
- 14 seriously ill or die at any age; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Former Governor Tom Wolf reported this
- 16 Commonwealth's first two confirmed cases in March 2020; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Since the first two confirmed cases, this

- 1 Commonwealth has experienced stay-at-home orders, mandatory
- 2 masking, school closures, business closures and restrictions,
- 3 hospitalizations, deaths of loved ones and financial hardships;
- 4 and
- 5 WHEREAS, As of May 3, 2023, this Commonwealth had nearly 3
- 6 million confirmed cases of COVID-19 and just over 51,000 deaths;
- 7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, It is important that the Commonwealth learns from
- 9 COVID-19 and makes improvements to the Commonwealth's ability to
- 10 respond to future similar events; and
- 11 WHEREAS, It is important for the Commonwealth to assess what
- 12 changes need to be made relating to emergency preparedness,
- 13 including the role of the Pennsylvania National Guard, public
- 14 health, the public school system, students, businesses, workers
- 15 and State and local government agencies in this Commonwealth;
- 16 therefore be it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the Joint
- 18 State Government Commission to conduct a study on the
- 19 Commonwealth's response to COVID-19; and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the Joint
- 21 State Government Commission to establish an advisory committee
- 22 consisting of, but not limited to, the following individuals to
- 23 conduct the study on the Commonwealth's response to COVID-19:
- 24 (1) The Secretary of Community and Economic Development
- or the secretary's designee.
- 26 (2) The Secretary of Education or the secretary's
- designee.
- 28 (3) The Secretary of Health or the secretary's designee.
- 29 (4) The Secretary of Human Services or the secretary's
- 30 designee.

- 1 (5) The Secretary of Labor and Industry or the
- 2 secretary's designee.
- 3 (6) The Secretary of Military and Veterans Affairs or
- 4 the secretary's designee.
- 5 (7) The Director of the Pennsylvania Emergency
- 6 Management Agency or the director's designee.
- 7 (8) A representative of hospitals and public health
- 8 systems.
- 9 (9) A representative of long-term care providers.
- 10 (10) A representative of nursing home operators.
- 11 (11) A representative of aging services.
- 12 (12) A representative of physicians.
- 13 (13) A representative of osteopathic physicians.
- 14 (14) A representative of emergency physicians.
- 15 (15) A representative of registered nurses.
- 16 (16) A representative of a union for caregivers, nurses
- and health care professionals.
- 18 (17) A representative of workers in the emergency and
- 19 nonemergency ambulance and medical transportation industry.
- 20 (18) A representative of businesses.
- 21 (19) A representative of local and independent business
- owners.
- 23 (20) A representative of labor councils.
- 24 (21) A representative of public school boards.
- 25 (22) A representative of public school teachers.
- 26 (23) A representative of child-care providers.
- 27 (24) A representative of nursing home operators.
- 28 (25) A representative of an organization advocating for
- 29 individuals who have an intellectual disability or are on the
- 30 autism spectrum.

- 1 (26) A representative of counties with a health
- 2 department.
- 3 (27) A representative of counties without a health
- 4 department.
- 5 (28) A representative of federally qualified health
- 6 centers.
- 7 (29) A representative of dentists.
- 8 (30) A representative of municipal police departments.
- 9 (31) Representatives from other Commonwealth agencies or
- 10 other entities that the Joint State Government Commission
- deems appropriate in conducting the study on the
- 12 Commonwealth's response to COVID-19.
- 13 (32) Any other individuals with knowledge and expertise
- in matters involving the Commonwealth's response to COVID-19;
- 15 and be it further
- 16 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission, in
- 17 collaboration with the advisory committee, compile a report
- 18 that, at a minimum, includes all of the following:
- 19 (1) A review and analysis of this Commonwealth's
- 20 response to COVID-19 relating to emergency preparedness,
- 21 including the role of the Pennsylvania National Guard, public
- health, the public school system, students, businesses,
- workers and State and local government agencies in this
- 24 Commonwealth.
- 25 (2) Policy recommendations and proposed legislation to
- implement necessary changes to the laws of this Commonwealth.
- 27 (3) Any other matters deemed appropriate by the Joint
- 28 State Government Commission;
- 29 and be it further
- 30 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission

- 1 establish the advisory committee within three months of the
- 2 adoption of this resolution; and be it further
- 3 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission present
- 4 its report to the House of Representatives no later than
- 5 January 1, 2025.
