AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Electric School Bus Grant Program and the
- 2 Electric School Bus Grant Program Fund; providing for duties
- of the Department of Education; and making an appropriation.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Electric
- 8 School Bus Grant Program Act.
- 9 Section 2. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Charging infrastructure." A facility or equipment that is
- 14 used to charge a battery or other energy storage device of a
- 15 vehicle that is fully or partially powered by electricity.
- 16 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 17 Commonwealth.
- "Disproportionately impacted community." Any of the

- 1 following:
- 2 (1) A community that is in a census block group, as
- 3 determined in accordance with the most recent Federal
- 4 decennial census, where:
- 5 (i) the proportion of households that are low income 6 is more than 40%;
- 7 (ii) the proportion of households that identify as 8 minority is more than 40%; or
- 9 (iii) the proportion of households that are cost-10 burdened is more than 40%.
- 11 (2) A community identified or approved by a State agency
 12 as a disproportionately impacted community if any of the
 13 following apply:
- 14 (i) The community has a history of environmental 15 racism perpetuated through redlining, anti-Indigenous, 16 anti-immigrant, anti-Hispanic or anti-Black laws.
- (ii) The community is impacted by multiple factors,
 including socioeconomic stressors, disproportionate
 environmental burdens, vulnerability to environmental
 degradation and a lack of public participation, which may
 act cumulatively to affect the health and environment and
 contribute to persistent disparities.
- "Electric-powered school bus." A school bus that is powered solely by electricity.
- 25 "Fund." The Electric School Bus Grant Program Fund
- 26 established under section 6(a).
- "Grantee." A recipient of a grant under the program.
- "Internal combustion engine school bus." A school bus
- 29 powered by diesel fuel or gasoline.
- 30 "Nonattainment area." An area of this Commonwealth that has

- 1 been designated by the Environmental Protection Agency as being
- 2 in nonattainment with national ambient air quality standards.
- 3 "Program." The Electric School Bus Grant Program established
- 4 under section 3(a).
- 5 "School bus." A school bus as defined in 75 Pa.C.S. § 102
- 6 (relating to definitions).
- 7 "School entity." A public school, including a charter school
- 8 or cyber charter school, intermediate unit or area career and
- 9 technical school operating within this Commonwealth.
- "Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.
- 11 Section 3. Electric School Bus Grant Program.
- 12 (a) Establishment. -- The Electric School Bus Grant Program is
- 13 established within the department. The department shall award
- 14 grants under the program to a school entity or a contracted
- 15 nonprofit organization or private entity acting on behalf of the
- 16 school entity to finance the following:
- 17 (1) The procurement and maintenance of electric-powered
- school buses, the conversion of internal combustion engine
- school buses to electric-powered school buses, charging
- infrastructure and electrical upgrades on each customer's
- 21 side of the meter as necessary to support charging
- 22 infrastructure.
- 23 (2) The administrative costs associated with the
- 24 procurements, conversions, maintenance or retirements
- specified under paragraph (1), including up-front
- 26 administrative costs associated with developing and
- implementing a proposal for the procurements, conversions or
- 28 maintenance.
- 29 (b) Duties. -- The department shall administer the program,
- 30 including providing the necessary technical assistance for the

- 1 program. The department may provide no more than the equivalent
- 2 of one-half of a full-time employee of the department to provide
- 3 technical assistance to a school entity regarding applying for a
- 4 grant under the program and implementing a project with the
- 5 awarded grant money.
- 6 (c) Application. -- The department shall establish an
- 7 application process for a school entity or a contracted
- 8 nonprofit organization or private entity acting on behalf of the
- 9 school entity to apply for a grant under the program. The
- 10 department shall post information about the program application
- 11 process, including an application form that the department
- 12 develops for the program, on the department's publicly
- 13 accessible Internet website.
- 14 Section 4. Criteria for awarding grants under program.
- 15 (a) Criteria. -- The department shall develop criteria for
- 16 awarding grants under the program, which shall include all of
- 17 the following:
- 18 (1) Giving priority to a school entity:
- 19 (i) located in or attended by students living in a 20 disproportionately impacted community;
- 21 (ii) located in a nonattainment area;
- 22 (iii) where at least a certain percentage of
- students, as determined by the department, receive free
- or reduced-price lunches under the National School Lunch
- 25 Program; or
- 26 (iv) that retires or converts at least a certain
- 27 percentage, as determined by the department, of the
- grantee's internal combustion engine school buses or
- retire or convert the grantee's internal combustion
- 30 engine school buses in a certain manner.

- 1 (2) Periodic reporting requirements for a grantee to 2 demonstrate that the grant money awarded under the program is
- 3 being used in accordance with this act.
- 4 (3) Procedures for addressing a grantee's noncompliance
- 5 with this act, including procedures for the reimbursement of
- 6 grant money awarded under the program.
- 7 (b) Limitation. -- The department shall limit the amount of a
- 8 grant awarded under the program to a school entity as necessary
- 9 to achieve cost parity between the costs associated with the
- 10 school entity's existing internal combustion engine school buses
- 11 and costs associated with the procurements, conversions,
- 12 maintenance, retirements and administrative costs specified
- 13 under section 3.
- 14 Section 5. Contract terms for transportation services.
- 15 (a) Transportation services.--If a contract for the
- 16 furnishing of transportation of students to and from a school
- 17 entity is executed by the school entity on or after the
- 18 effective date of this subsection, the contract shall be made
- 19 for a term not to exceed 15 years. The contract shall be
- 20 renewable at the option of the school entity and the party
- 21 contracted to provide transportation services, jointly, at the
- 22 end of the term of the contract. The renewed contract shall
- 23 include all of the terms and conditions of the previous
- 24 contract, including any provisions increasing rates based on
- 25 increased costs.
- 26 (b) School bus leases.--
- 27 (1) Except as provided under paragraph (2), if a
- contract is executed by a school entity for the lease or
- 29 rental of a school bus on or after the effective date of this
- 30 subsection, the contract shall be made for a term not to

- 1 exceed 15 years.
- 2 (2) If the contract under paragraph (1) provides that
- 3 the school entity may exercise an option to purchase the
- 4 school bus or cancel the lease or rental at the end of each
- 5 annual period during the period of the contract, the contract
- 6 may be made for a term not to exceed 20 years.
- 7 (c) Negotiations.--Notwithstanding any other provision of
- 8 law, nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit a
- 9 contract specified under subsection (a) or (b) from being
- 10 negotiated annually within the contract period when economic
- 11 factors indicate negotiation is necessary to maintain an
- 12 equitable pricing structure, subject to the approval of each
- 13 contracting party.
- 14 (d) Compliance. -- Any rental, lease or lease-purchase of a
- 15 school bus shall comply with any other applicable laws of this
- 16 Commonwealth.
- 17 Section 6. Electric School Bus Grant Program Fund.
- 18 (a) Establishment. -- The Electric School Bus Grant Program
- 19 Fund is established within the State Treasury. The department
- 20 shall administer the fund for the purposes of this act. The fund
- 21 consists of money transferred or appropriated to the fund for
- 22 implementation of the program and available money from Federal
- 23 sources and gifts, grants and donations received under
- 24 subsection (b).
- 25 (b) Sources.--
- 26 (1) The fund shall consist of money appropriated to the
- fund by the General Assembly.
- 28 (2) The department may seek, accept and receive money
- 29 from Federal sources and gifts, grants and donations from
- 30 public and private entities for deposit into the fund. The

- department shall transmit money received under this paragraph
- 2 to the State Treasurer, who shall deposit the money into the
- 3 fund.
- 4 (c) Appropriations. -- Money in the fund is appropriated on a
- 5 continuing basis to the department for the purposes of this act.
- 6 The State Treasurer shall credit all interest and income derived
- 7 from the deposit and investment of money in the fund to the
- 8 fund. Unexpended and unencumbered money remaining in the fund at
- 9 the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse.
- 10 (d) Direct or indirect costs. -- The department may use up to
- 11 8% of the money in the fund to cover the direct and indirect
- 12 costs the department incurs in administering the program.
- 13 (e) Technical assistance. -- The department shall reserve a
- 14 portion of the money in the fund to provide ongoing technical
- 15 assistance to a school district to seize available Federal funds
- 16 and understand fleet transition considerations for the school
- 17 district's specific situation.
- 18 Section 7. Contracted nonprofit organizations or private
- 19 entities.
- In order to expediently process contracts for the provision
- 21 of transportation services funded by a grant awarded under the
- 22 program, a school entity may select a preapproved contracted
- 23 nonprofit organization or private entity that meets all of the
- 24 following criteria:
- 25 (1) The nonprofit organization or private entity
- 26 provides any of the following:
- 27 (i) An electric school bus.
- 28 (ii) An electric school bus charging infrastructure.
- 29 (iii) Charging and charging management services.
- 30 (iv) Electric school bus services.

- 1 (2) The nonprofit organization or private entity has
- 2 sought and received approval from the secretary to provide
- any of the products or services listed under paragraph (1).
- 4 Section 8. Reports.
- 5 (a) Submission.--On or before January 1, 2025, and on or
- 6 before January 1 of each odd-numbered year thereafter, the
- 7 department shall prepare a report summarizing the progress of
- 8 the program and submit the report to the following:
- 9 (1) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 10 Education Committee of the Senate.
- 11 (2) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 12 Education Committee of the House of Representatives.
- 13 (3) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 14 Environmental Resources and Energy Committee of the Senate.
- 15 (4) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 16 Environmental Resources and Energy Committee of the House of
- 17 Representatives.
- 18 (5) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 19 Transportation Committee of the Senate.
- 20 (6) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 21 Transportation Committee of the House of Representatives.
- 22 (b) Accessibility. -- The department shall post a copy of each
- 23 report under subsection (a) on the department's publicly
- 24 accessible Internet website.
- 25 Section 9. Effective date.
- 26 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
