## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled "An 1 act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and 2 brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and 3 4 restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, 5 consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding 6 7 in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the 8 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing 10 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, 11 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective 12 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain 13 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure 14 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; 15 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," in 16 17 licenses and regulations and liquor, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages, further providing for hours of operation 18 relative to manufacturers, importing distributors and 19 20 distributors. 21 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

22 hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 492.1(a) of the act of April 12, 1951
(P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, is amended to read:
Section 492.1. Hours of Operation Relative to Manufacturers,

1 Importing Distributors and Distributors.--(a) (1)

[Manufacturers] Except as otherwise provided, manufacturers may sell or deliver malt or brewed beverages between two o'clock antemeridian of any Monday and twelve o'clock midnight of the following Saturday. <u>Manufacturers may operate extended hours on</u> <u>December 31 of each calendar year until two o'clock antemeridian</u>

## 7 January 1 of the following calendar year.

8 (2)Notwithstanding any other provision of law, 9 manufacturers may sell malt and brewed beverages and alcohol subject to section 446(a)(2) for on-premises consumption between 10 the hours of nine o'clock antemeridian and twelve o'clock 11 12 antemeridian Monday through Saturday and Sunday between the 13 hours of nine o'clock antemeridian and eleven o'clock 14 postmeridian. MANUFACTURERS MAY OPERATE EXTENDED HOURS ON <---15 DECEMBER 31 OF EACH CALENDAR YEAR UNTIL TWO O'CLOCK ANTEMERIDIAN JANUARY 1 OF THE FOLLOWING CALENDAR YEAR. 16 17 (3) The board may issue a manufacturer an on premise <---18 extended hours permit permitting the manufacturer to remain open 19 and sell alcohol until two o'clock antemeridian the following 20 calendar day. Following a fifty-dollar (\$50) fee, a manufacturer 21 must submit a written application for an on-premise extended <--22 hours permit under this paragraph to the board in a form 23 prescribed by the board. The following shall apply: 24 (i) Only one manufacturer on premise extended hours permit <--

25 may be issued to a manufacturer per calendar year and may only

26 <u>be used for one day in that calendar year AT ALL THE</u> <--

28 (ii) The manufacturer shall provide written notice to the
