1 2 4 5 6 7	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study, further providing for firefighter and emergency service training and establishing the Secondary Education Fire Training Pilot Program and the Fire Training Fund.
9	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
10	hereby enacts as follows:
11	Section 1. Section 1550 of the act of March 10, 1949
12	(P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is
13	amended to read:
14	Section 1550. Firefighter and Emergency Service Training
15	(a) [Beginning with the 2003-2004 school year and each school
16	year thereafter, a school district] <u>A school entity or nonpublic</u>
17	school may offer firefighter and emergency service training as
18	credit-earning courses to students of the age of sixteen (16)

years or older, except as otherwise provided in subsection (c).
Such courses may include:

3 (1) Training as a Firefighter I from the National Board on4 Fire Service Professional Qualifications.

5 (2) Training as an emergency medical technician pursuant to 6 the act of July 3, 1985 (P.L.164, No.45), known as the 7 "Emergency Medical Services Act."

8 (b) A school [district] entity or nonpublic school that offers firefighter and emergency service training as credit-9 10 earning courses shall provide transportation to and supervision 11 during any firefighter and emergency service training program 12 that takes place off school grounds. Supervision of training 13 shall be conducted as a cooperative education program in 14 accordance with the provisions of 22 Pa. Code § 11.28 (relating 15 to out-of-school programs and part-time employment).

16 (c) The Secondary Education Fire Training Pilot Program is 17 established. The purpose of the pilot program is to provide high 18 school students with instruction through a partnership between 19 institutions of higher education OR FIRE AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL <--20 SERVICE TRAINING INSTITUTIONS and school entities or nonpublic 21 schools, or both, to increase the number of individuals capable 22 of becoming CAREER OR volunteer firefighters. The pilot program <--23 shall be implemented in accordance with section 7 of the act of

24 October 24, 2012 (P.L.1209, No.151), known as the Child Labor

25 Act, and the following:

26 <u>(1) The State Fire Commissioner shall accept proposals from</u> <--

27 <u>institutions of higher education in this Commonwealth for the</u>

28 pilot program. From the proposals submitted, the State Fire

29 <u>Commissioner shall select three institutions of higher education</u>

30 to offer the pilot program. The State Fire Commissioner, to the

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1 greatest extent practicable, shall select one institution of	
2 higher education each from the eastern, central and western	
3 regions of this Commonwealth. Nothing in this section shall	
4 prohibit an institution of higher education from incorporating	
5 <u>emergency medical services instruction in the pilot program.</u>	
6 (1) (I) THE STATE FIRE COMMISSIONER SHALL ACCEPT PROPOSALS <	
7 FROM INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION OR FIRE AND EMERGENCY	
8 MEDICAL SERVICE TRAINING INSTITUTIONS IN THIS COMMONWEALTH FOR	
9 THE PILOT PROGRAM.	
10 (II) FROM THE PROPOSALS SUBMITTED UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I),	
11 THE STATE FIRE COMMISSIONER SHALL SELECT FOUR INSTITUTIONS OF	
12 HIGHER EDUCATION OR FIRE AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE TRAINING	
13 INSTITUTIONS TO OFFER THE PILOT PROGRAM. THE STATE FIRE	
14 COMMISSIONER, TO THE GREATEST EXTENT PRACTICABLE, SHALL SELECT	
15 ONE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION OR FIRE AND EMERGENCY	
16 MEDICAL SERVICE TRAINING INSTITUTION EACH FROM:	
17 (A) THE EASTERN REGION OF THIS COMMONWEALTH;	
18 (B) THE CENTRAL REGION OF THIS COMMONWEALTH;	
19 (C) THE WESTERN REGION OF THIS COMMONWEALTH; AND	
20 (D) ANYWHERE IN THIS COMMONWEALTH, SO LONG AS THE	
21 INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION OR FIRE AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL	
22 SERVICE TRAINING INSTITUTION HAD ENTERED INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH	
23 AN UNDERREPRESENTED SCHOOL ENTITY.	
24 (III) NOTHING IN THIS SECTION SHALL PROHIBIT AN INSTITUTION	
25 OF HIGHER EDUCATION OR FIRE AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE	
26 TRAINING INSTITUTION FROM INCORPORATING EMERGENCY MEDICAL	
27 SERVICES INSTRUCTION IN THE PILOT PROGRAM.	
28 (2) An institution of higher education OR FIRE AND EMERGENCY <	
29 MEDICAL SERVICE TRAINING INSTITUTION selected by the State Fire	
30 Commissioner shall operate the pilot program by entering into an	
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1	agreement with a school entity or nonpublic school, or both, for
2	the provision of fire instruction to students who are in at
3	least the ninth grade and leading to Firefighter I
4	certification.
5	(3) A nonlapsing, restricted account is established in the
6	State Treasury, to be known as the Fire Training Fund. The State
7	Fire Commissioner may accept monetary donations and other money
8	for deposit into the Fire Training Fund from a person, business,
9	foundation, tax-exempt organization under 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3)
10	(relating to exemption from tax on corporations, certain trusts,
11	etc.) or government entity on behalf of the Commonwealth.
12	(4) Money may be appropriated to the State Fire Commissioner
13	to carry out the provisions of this subsection. Each institution
14	of higher education OR FIRE AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE <
15	TRAINING INSTITUTION offering the pilot program shall receive at
16	least one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) for the
17	duration of the pilot program.
18	(5) Any funds appropriated, donated or transferred under
19	this subsection and interest earned on the Fire Training Fund
20	shall be deposited into the Fire Training Fund.
21	(6) During the pilot program, the Legislative Budget and
22	Finance Committee shall conduct a survey of volunteer fire
23	companies in the municipalities surrounding the school entities
24	and nonpublic schools that participate in the pilot program to
25	determine whether the pilot program is increasing the number of
26	volunteer firefighters and any additional recommendations. The
27	results of the survey shall be submitted to the chair and
28	minority chair of the Veterans Affairs and Emergency
29	Preparedness Committee of the Senate and the chair and minority
30	chair of the Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness

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1	Committee of the House of Representatives within six (6) months
2	of the expiration of the pilot program.
3	(7) The pilot program shall expire four (4) years from the
4	effective date of this paragraph.
5	(d) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
