## AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3
- 4
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in miscellaneous provisions relating 5
- to institutions of higher education, establishing the Hunger-6
- Free Campus Grant Program and the Hunger-Free Campus Grant
- Fund. 8
- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 10 hereby enacts as follows:
- 11 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 12 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 13 section to read:
- 14 Section 2002-I. Hunger-Free Campus Grant Program.
- 15 (a) Establishment. -- The Hunger-Free Campus Grant Program is
- 16 established within the Department of Education for the purposes
- 17 under subsection (b).
- 18 (b) Purpose. -- The purpose of the Hunger-Free Campus Grant
- Program shall be to provide grants to public institutions of 19

- 1 higher education that have one or more campuses designated by
- 2 the Secretary of Education as hunger-free campuses under
- 3 subsection (c). The purpose of the grant funding shall be to:
- 4 <u>(1) Address student hunger.</u>
- 5 (2) Leverage more sustainable solutions to address basic
- food needs on campus.
- 7 (3) Raise awareness of services currently offered on
- 8 <u>campus which address basic food needs.</u>
- 9 <u>(4) Continue to build strategic partnerships at the</u>
- 10 Federal, State and local levels to address food insecurity
- 11 <u>among students.</u>
- 12 <u>(c) Hunger-free campus designation.--In order to be</u>
- 13 <u>designated as a hunger-free campus, a public institution of</u>
- 14 higher education shall:
- 15 (1) Establish a hunger task force that meets a minimum
- of three times per academic year to set at least two goals
- 17 with action plans and includes representatives from the
- 18 current student body.
- 19 (2) Designate a staff member responsible for assisting
- 20 students with enrollment in the Supplemental Nutrition
- 21 Assistance Program (SNAP).
- 22 (3) Provide options for students to utilize SNAP
- benefits at campus stores or provide students with
- information on establishments in the surrounding area of
- 25 <u>campus where they can utilize SNAP EBT benefits.</u>
- 26 (4) Participate in an awareness day campaign activity
- 27 <u>and plan a campus awareness event during the National Hunger</u>
- and Homelessness Awareness Week.
- 29 <u>(5) Provide at least one physical food pantry on campus</u>
- or enable students to receive food through a separate,

- 1 <u>stigma-free arrangement with a local food pantry or food bank</u>
- 2 <u>near campus.</u>
- 3 (6) Develop a student meal credit donation program or
- 4 <u>designate a certain amount of money for free meal vouchers</u>
- 5 <u>for students.</u>
- 6 (7) Annually conduct a student survey on hunger,
- 7 <u>developed by the Department of Education, and submit the</u>
- 8 <u>results of the survey to the Secretary of Education at a time</u>
- 9 <u>prescribed by the Secretary of Education for inclusion in a</u>
- 10 comparative profile of each campus designated as a hunger-
- free campus. Survey data on student hunger shall be
- 12 <u>disaggregated by race, gender identity, sexual orientation,</u>
- 13 parenting status and financial aid status of students. In the
- 14 <u>development of the survey, the Department of Education may</u>
- 15 <u>utilize any existing surveys designed to collect information</u>
- on food insecurity among students enrolled in public
- institutions of higher education.
- 18 (d) Allocation.--The Secretary of Education shall allocate
- 19 grant funding to each public institution of higher education
- 20 that has one or more campuses designated by the Secretary of
- 21 Education as a hunger-free campus as provided under subsection
- 22 (c). The Secretary of Education, or a designee, shall determine
- 23 the amount of each grant which shall be used by the public
- 24 institution of higher education to further address food
- 25 insecurity among students enrolled in the public institution of
- 26 higher education. The Secretary of Education or a designee shall
- 27 prioritize grants to public institutions of higher education
- 28 serving minority, low-income and high Pell-grant-recipient
- 29 <u>campuses.</u>
- 30 (e) Report. -- The Department of Education shall submit a

- 1 report to the Governor, the chair and minority chair of the
- 2 Education Committee of the Senate, and the chair and minority
- 3 chair of the Education Committee of the House of Representatives
- 4 <u>no later than two years after the establishment of the Hunger-</u>
- 5 Free Campus Grant Program. The report shall include, but not be
- 6 limited to, the number and amounts of the grant awards, the
- 7 <u>impact the Hunger-Free Campus Grant Program had on establishing</u>
- 8 <u>additional hunger-free campuses at public institutions of higher</u>
- 9 <u>education and reducing the number of students experiencing food</u>
- 10 insecurity, the disaggregated data on students served reflecting
- 11 the students' race, gender identity, sexual orientation,
- 12 parenting status and financial aid status and recommendations on
- 13 the expansion of the Hunger-Free Campus Grant Program.
- (f) Hunger-Free Campus Grant Fund. -- The Hunger-Free Campus
- 15 Grant Fund is established as a special fund in the State
- 16 Treasury. The following shall apply to the operation of the
- 17 fund:
- 18 <u>(1) Money in the fund shall be appropriated on a</u>
- 19 continuing basis to the Department of Education for the
- 20 purpose of awarding grants under this section.
- 21 (2) The sum of \$1,000,000 shall be transferred from the
- 22 General Fund to the Hunger-Free Campus Grant Fund to be used
- 23 exclusively for the Hunger-Free Campus Grant Fund.
- 24 (q) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 25 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 26 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 27 <u>"Public institution of higher education." Any of the</u>
- 28 <u>following:</u>
- 29 (1) A community college operating under Article XIX-A.
- 30 (2) A rural regional college established under Article

- 1 XIX-G.
- 2 (3) A university within the State System of Higher
- 3 <u>Education under Article XX-A.</u>
- 4 (4) A State-related institution as defined in section
- 5 <u>2001-C.</u>
- 6 (5) The Thaddeus Stevens College of Technology.
- 7 (6) The Pennsylvania College of Technology.
- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
