## AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study, further providing for agreements with institutions of higher education; and establishing the Committee on Diversification 7 of the Education Workforce, the Diversification of the Education Workforce Account and the Diversification of the Education Workforce Grant Program. 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 11 12 hereby enacts as follows: 13 Section 1. Section 1525 of the act of March 10, 1949 14 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is 15 amended to read: 16 Section 1525. Agreements with Institutions of Higher 17 Education. -- (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to 18 the contrary, a school district [may] shall enter into an 19 agreement with [one or more institutions] an institution of higher education approved to operate in this Commonwealth in 20 order to allow resident students to attend [such institutions] 21

- 1 <u>the institution</u> of higher education while the resident students
- 2 are enrolled in the school district. [The] A school district may
- 3 <u>enter into additional agreements with other institutions of</u>
- 4 <u>higher education approved to operate in this Commonwealth in</u>
- 5 order to allow resident students to attend the institutions of
- 6 <u>higher education while the resident students are enrolled in the</u>
- 7 school district.
- 8 (b) Any agreement [may] between a school district and an
- 9 institution of higher education shall be structured so that:
- 10 (1) high school students [may] receive credits [toward
- 11 completion of courses at the school district and at
- 12 institutions] at or through an institution of higher education
- 13 approved to operate in this Commonwealth. The credits received
- 14 by a high school student under this section shall be the same
- 15 credits offered to a student enrolled at the institution of
- 16 higher education;
- 17 (2) high school students may also receive credits toward the
- 18 completion of courses required for graduation at the school
- 19 district;
- 20 (3) courses may be offered in-person, online or a
- 21 combination of in-person and online; and
- 22 (4) a school district may pay for tuition, fees, supplies or
- 23 <u>other costs related to a high school student enrolling in</u>
- 24 courses at an institution of higher education.
- 25 (c) When possible, the courses for which a high school
- 26 student receives credits under an agreement entered into under
- 27 this section shall be aligned to the graduation requirements of
- 28 the high school student's school district, the requirements of a
- 29 career and technical education program offered by the high
- 30 school student's school or a career pathway offered by the high

- 1 school student's school.
- 2 (d) A school district that enters into an agreement under
- 3 this section shall weight credits for a high school student in a
- 4 <u>manner similar to Advanced Placement Program or International</u>
- 5 Baccalaureate Diploma Program courses in the school district's
- 6 grading system, including both academic and technical courses.
- 7 <u>(e) At least once per school year, a school district shall</u>
- 8 provide to the Department of Education the number and form of
- 9 agreements the school district has entered into under this
- 10 section and the number of high school students participating in
- 11 the agreements, including total credits earned. The Department
- 12 of Education shall compile the information received under this
- 13 <u>subsection and include it in the department's electronic</u>
- 14 database or software program and portal established under
- 15 section 2005-C(4).
- 16 (f) (1) Nothing in this section shall be construed to
- 17 supersede or preempt a provision of a collective bargaining
- 18 agreement between a school district and an employe organization,
- 19 or a right of an employe organization under the provisions of
- 20 the act of July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), known as the "Public"
- 21 Employe Relations Act."
- 22 (2) As used in this subsection, the term "employe"
- 23 organization" shall have the meaning given to it in section
- 24 <u>1101-A</u>.
- 25 Section 2. The act is amended by adding an article to read:
- 26 ARTICLE XV-K
- 27 <u>DIVERSIFICATION OF EDUCATION WORKFORCE</u>
- 28 <u>Section 1501-K. Scope.</u>
- 29 This article relates to diversification of the Commonwealth's
- 30 education workforce.

- 1 Section 1502-K. Definitions.
- 2 The following words and phrases when used in this article
- 3 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 4 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 5 "Account." The Diversification of the Education Workforce
- 6 Fund established under section 1505-K(a).
- 7 "Board." The State Board of Education.
- 8 "Committee." The Committee on Diversification of the
- 9 Education Workforce established under section 1503-K(a).
- 10 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 11 <u>Commonwealth.</u>
- "Every Student Succeeds Act." The Every Student Succeeds Act
- 13 (Public Law 114-95, 129 Stat. 1802).
- 14 <u>"Grant program." The Diversification of the Education</u>
- 15 Workforce Program established under section 1506-K.
- 16 "School entity." A school district, intermediate unit,
- 17 charter school, cyber charter school, area career and technical
- 18 school or intermediate unit.
- 19 Section 1503-K. Committee on Diversification of the Education
- Workforce.
- 21 (a) Establishment. -- The Committee on Diversification of the
- 22 Education Workforce is established within the department.
- 23 <u>(b) Duties.--</u>
- (1) Within 30 days of the effective date of this
- 25 <u>section, the department shall appoint representatives to the</u>
- 26 committee. The committee shall, at a minimum, include a
- 27 representative from each of the following:
- 28 (i) The Pennsylvania School Boards Association.
- 29 <u>(ii) The Pennsylvania Association of Career and</u>
- 30 Technical Administrators.

1	(iii) The Pennsylvania State Education Association.
2	(iv) The American Federation of Teachers.
3	(v) The Pennsylvania Association of School
4	Administrators.
5	(vi) The Center for Black Educator Development.
6	(vii) The Pennsylvania Coalition of Public Charter
7	Schools.
8	(viii) The Pennsylvania Association of Colleges and
9	Teacher Educators.
10	(ix) The Pennsylvania Association of School Business
11	Officers.
12	(2) Within 90 days of the appointment of the committee
13	under paragraph (1), the committee shall, after consultation
14	and input from career and technical education programs across
15	this Commonwealth and national sources, provide the
16	department with a blended competency list and validated and
17	aligned materials and end-of-program assessments needed to
18	create a program of study in the education field.
19	(3) Within 120 days of the date when the committee
20	provided the required information to the department under
21	paragraph (2), the department shall develop the necessary
22	guidelines, standards and materials to implement additional
23	fields of study in education into a program of study for
24	career and technical education programs across this
25	<pre>Commonwealth.</pre>
26	Section 1504-K. Program of study.
27	(a) Development The department shall develop, in
28	accordance with the provisions of the Carl D. Perkins Career and
29	Technical Education Improvement Act of 2006 (Public Law 88-210,
30	20 U.S.C. § 2301 et seq.), a program of study specific to

- 1 occupations classified under the classification of program code
- 2 that require a postsecondary certificate, an associate degree or
- 3 baccalaureate degree.
- 4 (b) Requirements. -- In the development of the program of
- 5 study under subsection (a), the department shall incorporate
- 6 <u>elements of secondary and postsecondary education</u>, including
- 7 <u>coherent and rigorous content aligned with any nationally</u>
- 8 recognized academic standards and relevant career and technical
- 9 <u>content in a coordinated, nonduplicative progression of courses</u>
- 10 to adequately prepare students to succeed in postsecondary
- 11 <u>education</u>.
- 12 <u>(c) Credits.--The program of study under subsection (a) may</u>
- 13 <u>include the opportunity for secondary education students to earn</u>
- 14 postsecondary education credits through articulation agreements
- 15 <u>between school districts with participating postsecondary</u>
- 16 <u>institutions</u>, which may lead to an industry recognized
- 17 credential or certificate at the postsecondary level or an
- 18 associate degree or a baccalaureate degree.
- 19 (d) Review of program. -- The board shall evaluate the
- 20 efficacy of the program of study under subsection (a) within one
- 21 year of the program first being offered and, at a minimum, every
- 22 three years thereafter. The board's evaluation under this
- 23 subsection shall include all of the following:
- 24 (1) Disaggregated data by Every Student Succeeds Act
- 25 subgroups on enrollment and participation in the program of
- 26 <u>study under subsection (a).</u>
- 27 (2) A description of the evaluation process to measure
- 28 the success of the program of study under subsection (a).
- 29 Section 1505-K. Diversification of the Education Workforce
- 30 Account.

- 1 (a) Establishment. -- The Diversification of the Education
- 2 Workforce Fund is established as a restricted account in the
- 3 General Fund.
- 4 (b) Use of funds. -- Money in the account is appropriated to
- 5 the department on a continuing basis to provide grants in
- 6 accordance with section 1506-K. The appropriation shall not
- 7 <u>lapse at the end of any fiscal year.</u>
- 8 (c) Contributions.--
- 9 <u>(1) The State Treasurer may accept gifts, donations,</u>
- 10 legacies or any other revenues, including allowable Federal
- 11 <u>funds, for deposit into the account.</u>
- 12 (2) Any interest that accrues in the account shall
- 13 <u>remain in the account.</u>
- 14 Section 1506-K. Diversification of the Education Workforce
- 15 <u>Grant Program.</u>
- 16 <u>(a) Establishment.--The Diversification of the Education</u>
- 17 Workforce Grant Program is established within the department as
- 18 a competitive grant program for institutions of higher education
- 19 to increase the racial and gender diversification of the
- 20 education workforce. The department shall award grants under the
- 21 grant program in accordance with the eligible uses under
- 22 subsection (b) and the guidelines established under subsection
- 23 (d).
- 24 (b) Eliqible uses of funds. -- Grants under the program may
- 25 only be used for:
- 26 (1) Covering tuition, fees, supplies or other costs
- 27 <u>relating to high school students enrolled at institutions of</u>
- higher education through an agreement between a school
- 29 district and an institution of higher education under section
- 30 1525.

- 1 (2) Programs designed and proven to increase the racial
- 2 and gender diversification of the education workforce.
- 3 (c) Application. -- The department shall develop an
- 4 application for a school entity or an institution of higher
- 5 education to apply for funding under this section. The
- 6 application shall be posted on the department's publicly
- 7 accessible Internet website.
- 8 (d) Program guidelines. -- The department may establish
- 9 guidelines for implementing the grant program under this
- 10 section. The quidelines shall be posted on the department's
- 11 <u>publicly accessible Internet website.</u>
- 12 <u>(e) Evaluation.--The department shall evaluate the</u>
- 13 <u>utilization of the grant program money</u>, including an analysis of
- 14 the total amount of grants awarded, each institution of higher
- 15 education that received a grant and the efficacy of the programs
- 16 <u>funded through the grant program, based on disaggregated data.</u>
- 17 The department shall conduct the evaluation, at a minimum, every
- 18 three years after the establishment of the grant program and
- 19 shall post the evaluation on the department's publicly
- 20 accessible Internet website.
- 21 Section 1507-K. Director of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion.
- No later than 60 days after the effective date of this
- 23 section, the Secretary of Education shall designate an
- 24 individual within the department as the Director of Diversity,
- 25 Equity and Inclusion. The Director of Diversity, Equity and
- 26 Inclusion shall be responsible for creating goals on increasing
- 27 the diversity of the education workforce and coordinating the
- 28 department's efforts to increase diversification within the
- 29 education workforce.
- 30 Section 1508-K. Reporting.

- 1 For the purpose of improving data collection and transparency
- 2 about the diversity of the education workforce, the department
- 3 shall annually collect and post information about all of the
- 4 <u>following on the department's publicly accessible Internet</u>
- 5 website:
- 6 (1) The racial and gender demographics of individuals
- 7 <u>enrolled in teacher preparation programs and the racial and</u>
- 8 <u>demographics of individuals who completed a teacher</u>
- 9 <u>preparation program in this Commonwealth.</u>
- 10 (2) The pass rates of educator certification test takers
- as delineated by race and gender.
- 12 (3) The teaching certificates issued by the department
- as delineated by race and gender.
- 14 (4) New teacher applicants and hires at each school
- 15 <u>entity as delineated by race and gender and by school entity,</u>
- school district and State level.
- 17 (5) Annual teacher retention rates as delineated by race
- 18 and gender and by school entity, school district and State
- 19 level.
- 20 (6) The racial and gender demographics of individuals
- 21 enrolled in a superintendent or principal certification
- 22 program.
- 23 (7) The racial and gender demographics of individuals
- who have completed a superintendent or principal
- 25 certification program.
- 26 (8) The current school year's professional employees,
- 27 <u>temporary professional employees serving as classroom</u>
- teachers, principals and nonteaching professional employees
- as delineated by race and gender and by school entity, school
- 30 district and State level.

- 1 (9) Any other data relating to racial and gender
- 2 <u>demographics of the education workforce, if available and</u>
- 3 <u>already collected by the school entity, as requested by the</u>
- 4 <u>department</u>.
- 5 <u>Section 1509-K. Temporary waiver.</u>
- 6 (a) Waiver. -- Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
- 7 <u>Secretary of Education shall waive the requirement to</u>
- 8 <u>satisfactorily complete the assessment of basic skills required</u>
- 9 under section 1207.3 and 22 Pa. Code 49.18(c) (relating to
- 10 assessment).
- 11 (b) Expiration. -- The waiver under subsection (a) shall
- 12 expire three years after the effective date of this section.
- 13 Section 3. The amendment of section 1525 of the act shall
- 14 apply to any agreement between a school district and an
- 15 institution of higher education entered into or renewed after
- 16 the effective date of this section.
- 17 Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
