1 2 3 4	Establishing the PennSERVE Office within the Department of Labor and Industry; creating the PennSERVE Advisory Board; providing for coordination of Commonwealth community service programs; and making a related repeal.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Short title.
8	This act shall be known and may be cited as the PennSERVE
9	Act.
10	Section 2. Purpose.
11	(a) DeclarationsThe General Assembly hereby declares the
12	following:
13	(1) Service to others is a hallmark of the American
14	character. Throughout history, Pennsylvanians have stepped up
15	to meet challenges by volunteering in their communities.
16	(2) Throughout Pennsylvania communities, there are unmet
17	human, environmental and economic needs.
18	(3) Pennsylvanians of all ages can improve their
19	communities and become more civically engaged through service

1 and volunteerism.

2 (b) Intent.--It is the intent of the General Assembly that3 this act promotes the following:

4 (1) Making community service the common expectation and5 experience of all Pennsylvanians.

6 (2) Renewing the ethic of civic responsibility in this7 Commonwealth.

8 (3) Involving and enrolling individuals in service 9 opportunities that will benefit this Commonwealth while 10 offering workforce development and life skills.

11 (4) Building on the existing organizational framework of 12 State, local and community-based programs and agencies to 13 expand full-time and part-time service opportunities for all 14 eligible individuals.

15 (5) Combining the energy, wisdom, strength and time of 16 our younger and older populations in order to address vital 17 social needs.

18 Section 3. Definitions.

19 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 20 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 21 context clearly indicates otherwise:

22 "Board." The PennSERVE Advisory Board established under23 section 8.

"Community-based agency." A private, nonprofit organization that is representative of a community or a significant segment of a community that is engaged in meeting human, educational or environmental community needs.

28 "Community service." The performance of tasks designated to 29 accomplish any of the following:

30 (1) The promotion of the well-being of children, older

adults, persons with physical or developmental disabilities
 or persons with low incomes.

3 (2) Educational development, including literacy
4 training, adult basic education courses or instruction in job
5 search skills, job application skills, school readiness or
6 postsecondary access.

7 (3) Projects or activities calculated to improve public8 health and safety.

9 (4) Environmental preservation, enhancement and 10 remediation, including the conservation of natural habitats, 11 maintenance of public lands or promotion of environmental 12 stewardship.

13 (5) Activities to increase the preparation of 14 individuals for disasters, improve individuals' readiness to 15 respond to disasters, help individuals recover from disasters 16 or help mitigate disasters.

17 (6) Facilitate access to services and resources that
18 contribute to the economic well-being of Pennsylvanians,
19 including financial literacy, healthy and affordable housing
20 or improved employment readiness or skills.

21 (7) Impact the quality of life of veterans and military 22 families.

(8) Educational activities, through a Pennsylvania
education system or community or governmental entity, which
instill an ethic of civic responsibility and citizenship in
all Pennsylvanians and in particular young Pennsylvanians.
"Department." The Department of Labor and Industry of the
Commonwealth.

2 "Office." The PennSERVE Office within the department3 established under section 4.

4 Section 4. PennSERVE Office established.

5 The PennSERVE Office is established within the department. 6 The department shall provide staff, space, equipment and 7 supplies for the office for the discharge of office duties. 8 Section 5. Responsibilities and duties of office.

9 The office shall:

10 (1) Administer programs of the National and Community11 Service Act of 1990 for the Commonwealth.

12 (2) Develop a three-year comprehensive national and
 13 community service plan and establishment of Commonwealth
 14 priorities.

15 (3) Administer a competitive process in compliance with 16 Federal regulations to select service programs to be included 17 in the applications to the Federal agency responsible for 18 administering the National and Community Service Act of 1990.

19 (4) Administer, oversee and monitor the performance and
 20 progress of funded programs, including evaluation, monitoring
 21 and providing technical assistance.

(5) Assist in the development of high-quality communityservice programs.

24 (6) Develop mechanisms for recruitment and placement of
25 individuals interested in participating in service programs,
26 with a special emphasis on engaging disconnected youth and
27 individuals from unserved communities.

28 (7) Facilitate publicity and recognition of volunteerism29 and community service.

30 Section 6. State coordination.

(a) Consultation.--The office shall meet and consult with
 other bureaus and offices of the department to coordinate and
 enhance the quality and efficiency of service, workforce
 development and job training programs.

(b) Education services. -- The office may develop jointly with 5 the Department of Education and the Pennsylvania Higher 6 7 Education Assistance Agency a plan to increase community service 8 opportunities for students and graduates. The office may assist the Department of Education and the Pennsylvania Higher 9 10 Education Assistance Agency in preparing a public information program for students and graduates to apprise them of community 11 12 service options.

13 (c) Aging services.--The office may work with the Department 14 of Aging to expand service opportunities that combine the human 15 resources of younger Pennsylvanians with the human resources of 16 older Pennsylvanians to expand intergenerational programs.

(d) Health services.--The office may develop with the Department of Health a proposal that will allow young people to be involved in health-related activities, including educational programs that are aimed at increasing awareness in communities and educational institutions about community health problems. Section 7. Federal coordination.

The office shall serve as the liaison between the Federal Government and State, county and local governments for submitting grant proposals, accessing funds, seeking changes in Federal community service laws and regulations and related purposes.

28 Section 8. PennSERVE Advisory Board.

29 (a) Establishment.--The PennSERVE Advisory Board is30 established within the department.

1 (b) Voting members.--

The board shall include at least 15 voting members 2 (1)but not more than 25 voting members, who shall serve for 3 renewable three-year terms consistent with Federal 4 5 regulations issued under the National and Community Service Act of 1990. 6 7 (2) Voting members of the board shall include the 8 following: 9 The Secretary of Labor and Industry, or a (i) 10 designee, who shall serve as the presiding officer of the 11 board. 12 The Secretary of Education or a designee. (ii) 13 (iii) The following individuals appointed by the 14 Governor: 15 A representative of a community-based agency (A) 16 or organization in this Commonwealth. 17 A representative of local government in this (B) 18 Commonwealth. 19 (C) A representative of local labor 20 organizations in this Commonwealth. 21 A representative of business. (D) 22 An individual who is at least 16 years of (E) 23 age, less than 26 years of age and who is a 24 participant or supervisor of a service program for 25 school-age youth or of a campus-based or national 26 service program. 27 A representative of a national service (F) 28 program. 29 An individual with expertise in the (G) educational, training and development needs of youth, 30

1 particularly disadvantaged youth. 2 An individual with experience in promoting (H) 3 the involvement of older adults who are 55 years of age or older in service and volunteerism. 4 5 A representative of the volunteer sector. (I) 6 (iv) A member of the Senate appointed by the 7 Majority Leader of the Senate, or a designee. 8 (v) A member of the House of Representatives 9 appointed by the Majority Leader of the House of 10 Representatives, or a designee. 11 (vi) A member of the Senate appointed by the 12 Minority Leader of the Senate, or a designee. 13 (vii) A member of the House of Representatives 14 appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of 15 Representatives, or a designee. 16 The Governor may appoint voting members of the board (3) who are educators, including representatives from 17 18 institutions of higher education and local education 19 agencies, and experts in the delivery of human, educational, 20 environmental or public safety services to communities and 21 individuals. 22 (c) Representation. -- A voting member of the board may 23 represent none, one or more than one category specified in 24 subsection (b)(2)(iii). 25 Ex officio, nonvoting members. -- The board shall include (d) 26 the following public officials as ex officio, nonvoting members: 27 The Secretary of Aging, or a designee. (1)28 (2) The Secretary of Community and Economic Development, 29 or a designee.

30 (3) The Secretary of Corrections, or a designee.

(4) The Secretary of Health, or a designee.

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(5) The Secretary of Human Services, or a designee.

3 (6) The executive director of the Pennsylvania Higher
4 Education Assistance Agency, or a designee.

5 (e) Public officials.--The terms of office of the elected public officials designated in subsection (b)(2)(iii)(B), (iv), 6 7 (v), (vi) and (vii) shall coincide with the terms of their 8 respective elective or appointive offices. Public official members shall continue to serve after the expiration of their 9 10 term until the appointing authority appoints a replacement unless the member is no longer a public official at the time of 11 12 their term expiration.

(f) Federal representative.--Consistent with Federal regulations, the individual who is an employee of the Federal agency responsible for administering the National and Community Service Act of 1990 and who is designated to serve as a representative to each State or group of States shall be included as an ex officio, nonvoting member on the board.

(g) Diversity.--To the extent practicable, the board shall be diverse with respect to race, ethnicity, religion, age, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, disability characteristics and geographic representation.

(h) Chairperson.--The chairperson of the board shall be elected by the voting members of the board. To be eligible to serve as chairperson, an individual must be an appointed, voting member of the board.

27 (i) Rules.--The board may adopt rules governing its28 organization and procedures.

(j) Compensation.--The members of the board shall receive nocompensation for their services on the board but shall be

reimbursed by the department for ordinary and necessary expenses
 incurred in the performance of their duties as members of the
 board.

4 (k) Consultation.--The board shall consult with and advise
5 the office on the development of a Statewide plan for expansion
6 of community service opportunities.

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(1) Goals.--The board shall:

8 (1) Encourage all Pennsylvanians to participate in9 community service.

(2) Disseminate information concerning community
 service.

12 (3) Monitor the effectiveness and geographical13 distribution of community service programs.

14 (m) Novel programs. -- The board may develop novel community 15 service programs.

16 (n) Support services.--The board shall be supported in its 17 duties by the staff of the office and may use operational 18 support services of the office, such as mailing and duplication 19 services, to carry out its duties.

20 Section 9. Repeal.

21 Repeals are as follows:

(1) The repeal under paragraph (2) is necessary toeffectuate this act.

24 (2) Article XXII-B of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177,
25 No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, is

26 repealed.

27 Section 10. Effective date.

28 This act shall take effect immediately.
