A RESOLUTION

Urging the Congress of the United States to pass a 1 constitutional amendment that provides that neither slavery 2 nor involuntary servitude may be imposed as a punishment for 3 a crime. 5 WHEREAS, Ratified in 1865, the Thirteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States states, "Neither slavery nor 6 involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime whereof 7 the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the 8 United States, or any place subject to their jurisdiction"; and 10 WHEREAS, The exception clause in the Thirteenth Amendment created a loophole that has allowed for legal slavery to persist 11 in the United States of America; and 12 13 WHEREAS, After ratification of the Thirteenth Amendment, states exploited this loophole by enacting laws, now commonly 14 15 referred to as "Black Codes," that allowed them to arrest and 16 imprison African Americans for minor offenses; and 17 WHEREAS, In addition, states engaged in convict leasing, a

practice where states leased prisoners to private contractors in

- 1 exchange for revenue; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The exception clause in the Thirteenth Amendment
- 3 facilitated and incentivized the over-incarceration of African
- 4 Americans and has led to our present moment where African
- 5 Americans are incarcerated at more than five times the rate of
- 6 White Americans; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Even as states have phased out convict leasing,
- 8 Federal law still requires all able-bodied Federal inmates to
- 9 work, pushing nearly 900,000 individuals into forced labor; and
- 10 WHEREAS, In recent years, voters in Colorado, Utah, Nebraska,
- 11 Alabama, Oregon, Tennessee and Vermont have approved ballot
- 12 measures to remove provisions in their respective state
- 13 constitutions that allowed for slavery and involuntary servitude
- 14 as a punishment for crime; and
- WHEREAS, On June 18, 2021, United States Senator Jeff Merkley
- 16 and United States Representative Nikema Williams introduced a
- 17 proposed amendment to the Constitution of the United States that
- 18 reads, "Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude may be imposed
- 19 as a punishment for a crime"; and
- 20 WHEREAS, It is time for our nation to close this racist
- 21 loophole in the Constitution of the United States and end legal
- 22 slavery; therefore be it
- 23 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 24 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge the Congress of the United
- 25 States to pass a constitutional amendment that provides that
- 26 neither slavery nor involuntary servitude may be imposed as a
- 27 punishment for a crime; and be it further
- 28 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to
- 29 the President of the United States, the presiding officers of
- 30 each house of Congress and each member of Congress from

1 Pennsylvania.
