A RESOLUTION

Designating September 18, 2023, as "Pitt Hopkins Syndrome 1 Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania to coincide with 2 "International Pitt Hopkins Syndrome Awareness Day." 3 4 WHEREAS, Pitt-Hopkins syndrome is a rare and severe neurological disorder caused by a spontaneous mutation or 5 6 deletion of the TCF4 gene; and 7 WHEREAS, Pitt-Hopkins syndrome is characterized by intellectual disability, developmental delays, breathing 8 problems of episodic hyperventilation, recurrent 10 seizures/epilepsy, gastrointestinal issues, the inability to 11 speak and distinctive facial features; and 12 WHEREAS, Approximately 700 people worldwide have been 13 diagnosed with Pitt-Hopkins syndrome; and 14 WHEREAS, The Pitt Hopkins Research Foundation annually 15 celebrates September 18 as "International Pitt Hopkins Syndrome 16 Awareness Day" to raise awareness for Pitt-Hopkins syndrome 17 research; and

WHEREAS, This date was chosen to bring awareness of the fact

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- 1 that this is a disorder caused by a spontaneous mutation or
- 2 deletion of the TCF4 gene located on the 18th chromosome; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The Pitt Hopkins Research Foundation is dedicated to
- 4 finding a cure for Pitt-Hopkins syndrome through research,
- 5 education and advocacy; therefore be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate
- 7 September 18, 2023, as "Pitt Hopkins Syndrome Awareness Day" in
- 8 Pennsylvania to coincide with "International Pitt Hopkins
- 9 Syndrome Awareness Day."
