## A RESOLUTION

Directing the Joint State Government Commission to conduct a 1 study on the cost and effectiveness of current and ongoing 2 Housing First programs across the United States and the potential effectiveness of Housing First programs in this Commonwealth. 5 6 WHEREAS, Housing First is a program focusing on providing housing to the unhoused, regardless of background, including 7 8 typical barriers like substance use disorder status; and 9 WHEREAS, Housing First programs operate under the belief that housing is an essential first step in recovering from being 10 11 unhoused; and WHEREAS, Utilizing Housing First programs may be most useful 12 13 for individuals who are chronically unhoused; and WHEREAS, The risk of being unhoused increases for an 14 15 individual with a low socioeconomic status, a mental health 16 disorder or a substance use disorder; and WHEREAS, On any given day, more than 15,000 residents of this 17

Commonwealth can be unhoused; and

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- 1 WHEREAS, On average, this Commonwealth has 11 unhoused
- 2 individuals for every 100,000 of the general population; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Veterans are more likely than the general population
- 4 to be unhoused due to a higher risk for traumatic brain injury
- 5 or post-traumatic stress disorder; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Education for Children and Youth
- 7 Experiencing Homelessness Program, which reduces barriers for
- 8 unhoused children to access local public schools, served 40,003
- 9 children; and
- 10 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth has 16 Continuum of Care districts
- 11 that receive Federal grants to serve the unhoused and other
- 12 populations; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Across the United States, there are six cities and
- 14 states that have implemented Housing First programs; and
- WHEREAS, Since the 2020 COVID-19 pandemic, several cities
- 16 across the country have struggled with providing services to
- 17 unhoused population and have declared states of emergency to
- 18 cope with this crisis; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The Biden Administration seeks to reduce the
- 20 unhoused population by 25% by 2025 using Housing First
- 21 principles; therefore be it
- 22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the Joint
- 23 State Government Commission to conduct a study on the cost and
- 24 effectiveness of current and ongoing Housing First programs
- 25 across the United States and the potential effectiveness of
- 26 Housing First programs in this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 27 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission compile
- 28 a report on the study that, at a minimum, includes the
- 29 following:
- 30 (1) An assessment of the state of the unhoused

- 1 population in this Commonwealth, including the state of the
- 2 most at-risk individuals and the individuals who are
- 3 currently experiencing chronic homelessness.
- 4 (2) Whether Housing First programs in other locations
- 5 across the United States, including California, Salt Lake
- 6 City, Utah and New Orleans, Louisiana, have reduced the
- 7 chronically unhoused population and the broader unhoused
- 8 population.
- 9 (3) Whether the United States Department of Veterans
- 10 Affairs' Housing First approach, which supports unhoused
- veterans and their families in finding permanent housing, has
- reduced the population of unhoused veterans in this
- 13 Commonwealth.
- 14 (4) The cost difference between Housing First programs
- and traditional shelter-based programs.
- 16 (5) The effect of recent events, including the 2020
- 17 COVID-19 pandemic, increases in the cost of living and the
- 18 reduction of funding for the Supplemental Nutrition
- 19 Assistance Program, on the unhoused population.
- 20 (6) The effect of children being unhoused on academic
- 21 performance in schools.
- 22 (7) Any other matter regarding the unhoused and Housing
- 23 First programs that the Joint State Government Commission
- 24 deems appropriate;
- 25 and be it further
- 26 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission be
- 27 authorized to request information that is not protected from
- 28 disclosure from State agencies and departments for the study;
- 29 and be it further
- 30 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission submit

- 1 the report with its findings and recommendations no later than
- 2 18 months after the adoption of this resolution to all of the
- 3 following:
- 4 (1) The President pro tempore of the Senate.
- 5 (2) The Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 6 (3) The Majority Leader of the Senate.
- 7 (4) The Minority Leader of the Senate.
- 8 (5) The Majority Leader of the House of Representatives.
- 9 (6) The Minority Leader of the House of Representatives.
